22nd Street Green Connection Implementation

The 22nd Street Green Connection project broke ground in January 2018; substantial completion is expected in September 2018.

When complete the project will create a green, inviting connection from Illinois Street (the Blue Greenway, Bay Trail and future housing and parks) to the 22nd St Caltrain station at lowa Street.

Minnesota Street (23rd - 25th Streets)



Public Works is seeking funding for design and construction. Planning and conceptual design in 2018, pending funding, with detailed design and construction to follow.

The Minnesota Street project will install sidewalks, lighting and streetscape amenities that will provide a safe and enjoyable pedestrian route to destinations on Minnesota Street. The project includes improvements to the unique linear garden, Minnesota Grove, restoring planting, adding furnishings and upgrading pathways, with lighting and paving, for accessible path of travel.

















Neighborhood Parking Plan
