Each member of the public may address the Committee for up to three minutes.

The Brown Act forbids a committee from taking action or discussing any item not appearing on the posted agenda, including those items raised at public comment. In response to public comment, the committee is limited to:

1. responding to statements made or questions posed by members of the public; or
2. requesting staff to report back on a matter at a subsequent meeting; or
3. directing staff to place the item on a future agenda. (Government Code Section 54954.2(a))







Project Goals

- ✓ Improve comfort & safety for all who travel on Brannan St
- ✓ Improve Brannan to meet current pressing safety needs
- ✓ Adapt Brannan Street to meet transportation needs now and into the near future




Why Brannan Street?

- ✓ Between July 2011 and June 2016, there were 156 people injured and 143 collisions reported on Brannan, of which one was fatal
- ✓ Brannan Street is on the city's High-Injury Network
- ✓ Opportunity to reconfigure the roadway in coordination with repaving project



Safety Improvements Coming to Brannan




- ✓ Travel lane reduction (4 to 3)
- ✓ Bike lanes in both directions
- ✓ Pedestrian improvements: *advanced limit lines, continental crosswalks, leading pedestrian intervals, more visibility at intersections*
- ✓ Traffic signal timing changes

Outreach

- ✓ Door-to-door outreach with merchants, businesses, and fronting properties
- ✓ Meetings with neighborhood organizations
- ✓ Sent a mailer to community members along the corridor


Concurrent Projects
