reviews recommendation for inclusion in Capital Plan

SFMTA Board Approves

20-Year Capital Plan financially unconstrained plan of all needs

Capital Funding Request (CFR)

scope, schedule & budget of prioritized project in Capital Plan submitted to CFPA

SFMTA's Capital Financial Planning & Analysis (CFPA) group

reviews request, matches appropriate funds, & offers recommendation to TCC

Transportation Capital Committee

reviews recommendation for inclusion in CIP

5-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP)

financially constrained program of projects. First 2 years of CIP = Capital Budget




IMPLEMENTING THE MUNI SERVICE EQUITY STRATEGY

- Muni Service Equity Policy adopted in May 2014 by SFMTA Board
- In collaboration with community advocates, SFMTA staff identified eight equity strategy neighborhoods based on a number of demographic factors
- The FY 2019 & 2020 budget includes Citywide and neighborhood-specific recommendations that will lead to measurable improvements on routes in the focus neighborhoods

- Provide backup power in the event of power outages


Parking


