<u>Boundaries</u>: Block bounded by York, Hampshire, 19th and 20th Streets, as well as three adjacent properties

Period of Significance: 1889-1892, 1920-1940

Eligibility: California Register of Historical Resources

<u>Thematic Summary</u>: This block-plus in the far eastern Mission District represents original uniform development with the signature Stick-style row-house cottages of Gottlieb Knopf, a prolific merchant builder in the eastern Mission District. The block contains the largest collection of Knopf buildings known to exist, and includes several that were "modernized" during the 20th-century interwar period in keeping with the general form, massing, and layout of Knopf's row-house designs.

This historic district, comprised of 23 contributors and 30 total properties, is the largest collection of Knopf buildings located in the eastern Mission and perhaps in San Francisco. Knopf constructed nearly every building on the block, as well as properties on surrounding blocks. Knopf was the single most prolific builder

in the east Mission District, with at least 93 buildings in the area attributable to him.

Before the U.S. era, most of the historic district area was occupied by the western, lowland edge of the *Potrero Nuevo*, or "new pasture," a vast rancho that included all of Potrero Hill. After the U.S. took control of San Francisco, pioneer settler George Treat fenced off the tract by 1850, and thus gained control of the land. By 1870, several other landowners had carved out small pieces of the Potrero Nuevo tract, apparently for the purpose of residential subdivision. However, the majority of the eastern Mission District did not build out until the 1890s, when streetcar line expansions to the area and population growth prompted development. Eventually, electric streetcar lines on nearby Potrero Avenue and Bryant Street (east and west of the subject block) provided convenient access to the area.

According to 1880 and 1900 Census records, Gottlieb Knopf was born in Germany in 1852, and emigrated to the U.S. at the age of 13. In San Francisco City Directories, he was identified throughout the 1880s as a carpenter. However, by 1890 Knopf was listed as an architect with an office at 328 Montgomery Avenue, located on the same block as master architect Thomas John Welsh; and in 1891 he appeared as contractor and builder living at 809 Chestnut Street. On the 1900 Census, he identified himself as a contractor and the owner of 2300 Leavenworth Street where he lived with his wife Anna and two sons, Adolph and Norman. By this time he had also Anglicized his first name to George. In 1909 he appeared in a San Francisco Chronicle real estate article as having borrowed \$19,000 for property located at Third Avenue and B Street in the Richmond District, and again in 1914 for selling what appears to be a portion of the same property. Knopf died in 1926 and was buried with his wife at Mountain View Cemetery in Oakland. Despite numerous examples of Knopf's work in the east Mission District, and his obvious importance in the historical development of the area, no reference for him appears in the index for the California Architect and Builders News, nor have any references been found for him in commonlyavailable reference books concerning San Francisco architecture.

The buildings of this historic district typify Knopf's work, which almost always consisted of mirrored one-story-over-raised-basement Stick/Eastlake-style single-family cottages, massed with a prominent projecting front bay and a narrow recessed side bay. By mirroring the floor plans of adjacent buildings, Knopf created large light wells between his residences, as well as regular rhythms of massing along the street. The regularity of his technique was so predictable that

his work can often be identified on Sanborn Fire Insurance Co. maps through the building silhouettes alone. Another distinguishing characteristic of Knopf's work was the use of flat roof construction rather than gable roofs, which were far more common during the era. It may be conjectured that the flat-roof design saved materials and money in the building of Knopf's working-class dwellings. Knopf also occasionally constructed Queen Anne-style cottages, as well as multi-story Stick/Eastlake-style mixed-use buildings, typically on corners lots at the edges of his residential developments (such as on the subject block at 2629 19th Street). Aside from the impressive collection of intact Knopf buildings on this block, particularly on the east side of York Street, the only other comparable groupings includes a row of three buildings located nearby on the west side of Potrero Avenue between 20th and 21st Streets, as well as three buildings on the east side of Hampshire Street between 23rd and 24th Streets.

Knopf's buildings appear to have been particularly susceptible to alterations, in part because Knopf's prototypical building plans proved adaptable to modernization. Virtually all his cottages have garage insertions, and the vast majority was altered in the early 20th century with Mediterranean Revival-style influences, such as stucco cladding, bay window reconfiguration, and barrel-tile accents, often the work of local eastern Mission District contractors. In some cases, such as on the subject block, alterations were implemented with design, workmanship, and materials that may be seen as significant modifications to Knopf's originals (and therefore contributors to the historic district), including examples in the Mediterranean Revival style and a single reimagining in Streamline Moderne. Examples of contributing, altered Knopf cottages are found within the historic district on Hampshire, 19th and 20th Streets.
