African American History Project Community Meeting

Join historic preservation consultants, Tim Kelley, Chris VerPlank, Al Williams, and Planning Staff for the African American History Project Community Event. The African American History Project is a city-wide effort to document the history of African Americans in San Francisco through oral histories, story-telling and group activities. The project will serve as an important step in the development of the African American Historic Context Statement, which will provide a foundation for the identification, evaluation, registration and treatment of historic properties associated with African American history.

At the community event, we will:

- Introduce the project to the public.
- Provide an overview of African American History in San Francisco.
- Document the experiences and memories of select participants for oral history interviews.
- Encourage public participation through alternative and interactive outreach methods including: video and audio recording, collecting historic photos, and sharing memories and photos through internet resources.

This event will be co-hosted by the African American Historical and Cultural Society and the African American Art and Culture Complex. The project is funded by a grant from the Historic Preservation Committee.
