Marcus Books/Jimbo's Bop City Building Designated Historic Landmark



On February 13, 2014, Historic Preservation Commissioners joined Karl Hasz, Diane Matsuda, and Johnathan Pearlman joined Mayor Lee as he signed legislation designating the Marcus Books/Jimbo's Bop City building, located at 1712-1716 Fillmore Street, as San Francisco's 266th city landmark. The building is significant for its association with African American history in the Fillmore District.

A special thanks to Supervisor London Breed and Mayor Lee for their support on making this landmark designation a priority for the city, and to the Marcus Books owners, Karen and Greg Johnson, for initiating this effort.
