Draft Urban Forest Plan Now Available

The department published the Draft Urban Forest Plan, a document that provides a vision and strategy to address the challenges facing the City's street trees. The Draft Urban Forest Plan (Phase 1: Street Trees) identifies policies and strategies to proactively manage, maintain and grow the City's street tree population. The proposed strategies include a mix of actions the City and its community partners can take to support the vision of creating an expanded, healthy and thriving urban forest.

San Francisco Planning Department Launched the Railyard Alternatives and I-280 Boulevard Feasibility Study Project

SF Planning Department launched the Railyard Alternatives and I-280 Boulevard Feasibility Study program by releasing a Request for Proposal (RFP) for transportation consultants to conduct the study. This multi-agency program will study the current transportation developments and infrastructure in the City, develop visual and conceptual designs, and establish promising alternatives for the area including and around the existing 4th & King Caltrain Railyard.
