On May 27, 2010, the Planning Commission conducted a Discretionary Review hearing to consider the following project:

969-971 Union Street, south side between Taylor and Jones Streets Lot 018, of Assessor's Block 0120. Mandatory Discretionary Review of a proposed Dwelling Unit Merger. The proposal is to merge two owner occupied dwelling units in a two-family residential building into one unit in the RM-2, Residential Mixed Moderate Density District and 40X Height and Bulk District.

## **ACTION**

The Planning Commission did not take Discretionary Review and approved the permit as submitted.

## **FINDINGS**

The Planning Commission found that:

- The proposed merger meets a majority of the merger criteria of Planning Code Section 317.
- The proposed merger of two dwelling units on the smallest lot in the area brings the building closer into compliance with the prevailing density of the similarly sized lots in the immediate area.
- Both units are now and will remain owner occupied on a full-time basis by the owner.
