Sa. Reconfigure crosswalks around Jane Warner Plaza. A new crosswalk could be added to directly link the SE corner of Castro and Market (Twin Peaks Tavern) to the NE corner (Pottery Barn). This would create a shorter, more direct and visible crossings. What do you think about this preliminary design?
