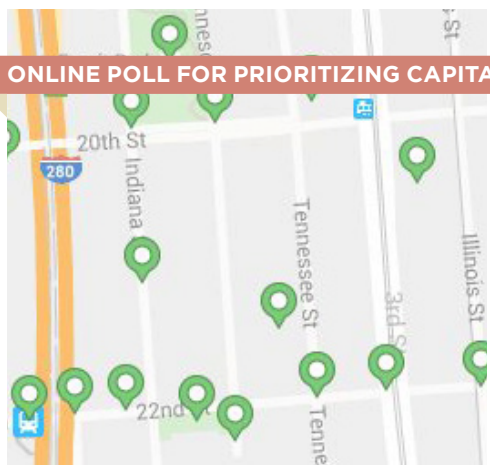

## ONLINE POLL FOR PRIORITIZING CAPITAL PROJECTS!

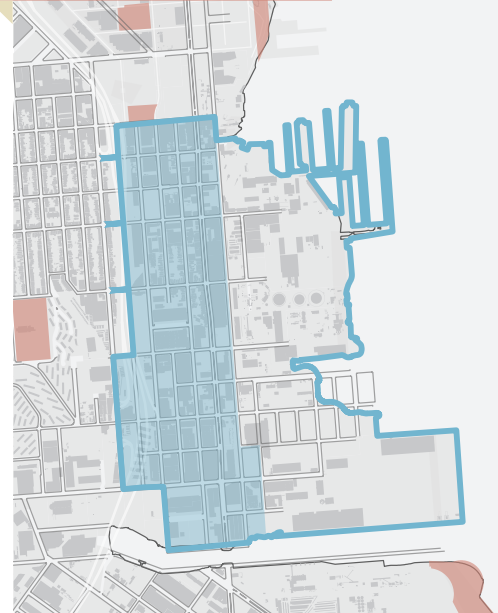
