







Examples of existing streets people identified that are like Green Connections

- Visitacion Valley Greenway
- The Wiggle
- Poppyland and Penny Lane
- Glen Park
- Alleys in Sunnyside
- Mid-block open paths in Balboa Terrace
- Paths at the top of San Jose Avenue
- Stairways
- Presidio
- Market Street (separated bike lanes)
- Valencia Street

















What is a Green Connection?

A Green Connection is a special street or path that connects people and wildlife to parks and open spaces















What is a Green Connection?























Key elements of Green Connections:

- **Encourage and Support Active Transportation**
- **Enhance Urban Ecology**
- Promote Stewardship and Placemaking











DRAFT Green Connections Network

- 25 Routes, 140+ miles
- Route name includes a geographic start & end point and a target species.
- Streets on the network provide opportunities for
 - greening and landscaping;
 - enhancing wildlife habitat;
 - managing stormwater;
 - calming traffic




Range of interventions:

- Block Treatments


