“Green Connections” is a two-year community based planning process led by the San Francisco Planning Department. The Project will result in a Citywide network of green streets that can be built over time—improving access to parks, open space and the waterfront. The project builds on current efforts to create sustainable corridors that enhance pedestrian and bicycle conditions, reduce stormwater runoff, improve wildlife habitat and green neighborhood streets. In the Western Addition Eddy was identified as a good candidate for a Green Connection. We are interested to hear your ideas on ways to green the street and make it safer to walk and bike along.

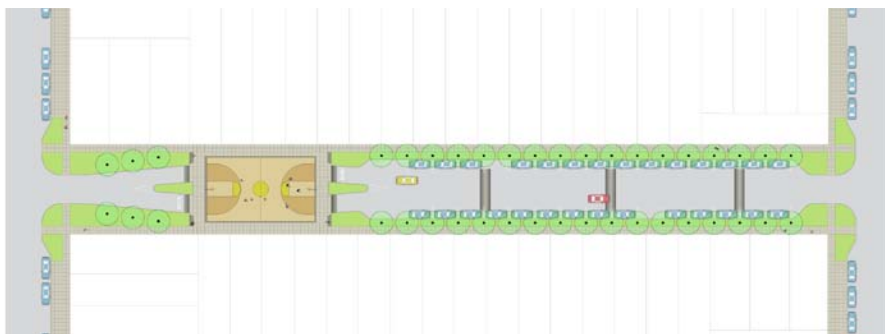

7. “Play Streets” can create large areas for people to gather and play. Traffic entering the play street can be calmed with the addition of bulb-outs (corner sidewalk extensions) or speed tables (like wide speed bumps) at the intersection. Play streets are appropriate on residential streets with very low traffic volumes or dead-end streets. Buchanan Street between the Buchanan Mall and Eddy Streets meets this criteria, and is where residents held a Play Streets event on July 13. What do you think about designing this block to allow more play streets?
