
Japantown's Osaka Way (Buchanan Mall) is the pedestrian portion of Buchanan Street that runs for one block between Post and Sutter streets. Along with Peace Plaza, it's the geographic and cultural heart of the neighborhood.

This walkway is lined by restaurants, stores, and cultural institutions on both sides, allowing residents and visitors to experience Japantown's culture in a pedestrian environment. Designed in the 1960s, Osaka Way is paved with a river of cobblestones, connecting two fountain installations, consisting of origami flower forms designed by renowned artist Ruth Asawa, and surrounded by low, circular stone walls.


In 2022, the project received a General Fund Grant of \$5,000,000 from the California Natural Resources Agency. The City has submitted applications for additional funding to implement the project.

The community has identified some areas where Osaka Way needs upgrades and the City has responded with conceptual design options.





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

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

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

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


