Neighborhood Meeting on the Proposed Rousseaus' Boulevard Tract Landmark District

Join San Francisco Planning to help celebrate and preserve the history and unique character of the Rousseaus' Boulevard Tract homes, soon to be considered for Landmark District designation.

Landmark districts are unique and irreplaceable assets to the City, serving to enhance and protect many of the physical surroundings in which past generations lived. The Rousseaus' Boulevard Tract homes, known for their whimsical Storybook Style architecture, were built among the sand dunes of the Sunset District in 1932 and 1933 by brothers Oliver and Arthur Rousseau.

This meeting will include an in-depth conversation on alterations and the building permit review process specifically for Landmark buildings. Preservation planners will be on hand to answer questions about the proposed Landmark designation, as well as any questions about your home improvement project and what the general permit review process means for you.
