



Join Us for a Neighborhood Meeting on the Proposed Rousseaus' Boulevard Tract Landmark District Designation

The Rousseaus' Boulevard Tract homes were built among the sand dunes of the Sunset District from 1932 - 1933 by brothers Oliver and Arthur Rousseau. The neighborhood quickly became home to a professionally diverse group of accountants, insurance agents and bank employees, mechanics, police officers, physicians and dentists, bakers, chemists and salespeople.

The 2012 Sunset District Historic and Cultural Resource Survey identified the Rousseaus' Boulevard Tract, bounded by 36th Avenue, Kirkham Street, 34th Avenue, and Lawton Street, as a potential historic district for its exceptional and intact architectural character. The Historic Preservation Commission adopted the Sunset survey findings on September 18, 2013. As the next step in designating the Tract as a landmark district, a follow up survey to further identify the exterior building and landscape details that are so unique to this special neighborhood was completed over the summer of 2016.

A draft of the landmark district designation report for the Rousseaus' Boulevard Tract will be available for public review on Tuesday, **November 15, 2016**. Join San Francisco Planning staff to learn more about the survey and designation report findings, next steps in the landmark designation process, and information on property benefits for owning a home in a local historic landmark district.
