WHAT WE HEARD

LIGHTING

- Extended gaps exist where street lighting is not provided
- New pedestrian lighting is expensive. Funding sources are challenging to identify, so creative citizen led project can be explored.
- Certain buildings are dark at night
- Areas around Waller, east of Steiner, Church & Duboce, Duboce Park, Fillmore & Hermann, Page from Peirce to Steiner need better lighting

- Additional street trees are welcomed, but there was concern regarding tree species, maintenance and safety concerns.
- Strong support for sidewalk landscaping because of concrete removal, but there was concern of maintenance and stewardship
- Minimal support for raised planters due to maintenance and stewardship concerns

DISTINCTIVE TREES

A popular item with the community, trees are a great way to enrich the street.
A tree species that is unique to Lower Haight can enhance the strong character of the street.



SIDEWALK LANDSCAPING

San Francisco Public Works issues low cost permits for sidewalk landscaping, which converts a portion of the sidewalk into an attractive landscaped area. Landscaped sidewalks are visually appealing, provide wildlife habitat, reduce flooding and increase property values. Sidewalk landscape can also occur in sidewalk extensions (see left)



STREET PLANTERS

Small fences can help prevent unwanted activity in the planters, and can be custom-designed for Haight Street.
